Tenskwatawa

Born: 1776-1839

Death: died of natural causes in a village he established near present day Kansas City.

Country of Origin: Shawnee First Nation

Interesting Fact: he was blind in one eye due to a childhood accident with a bow and arrow.

Importance to Canadian History: he was the spiritual leader of Tecumseh's Indian

Confederacy. He was responsible for looking after matters at Prophetstown while Tecumseh was away on official business. He led the doomed defense of Prophetstown during the Battle of Tippecanoe against the Americans. He was present at the Battle of the Thames but fled with the British (and was absent from the field of battle while his brother Tecumseh was killed).
