On the Right Level Activity Sheet

Canada has a **federal system** of government: power is divided up and shared between a strong national government and smaller local governments. Technically speaking, the *British North America Act* (1867) only established *two* official levels of government—federal (based in Ottawa) and provincial (each provincial or territorial capital city); however, by convention a third level developed in the form of town and city councils, e.g. municipal. The authority of municipal governments emerged over time on the basis of *convention* (developing customs and needs) rather than through a constitution.
